#### **Our Gifts from God**

It is time to begin Christmas gift shopping for our families. I, for one, struggle with finding special gifts for my friends and family that they will appreciate. One Christmas, my aunt gave my son a hand-made wooden car. As soon as he opened it, he threw it on the ground and cried, "I don't want that!" He clearly did not appreciate and downright despised the gift. I was ashamed, not only for him, because it made me think of how often I have felt the same way about gifts I have received. I may not throw them on the floor, but I cast them down in my heart. Sadly, the Bible tells us how we treat the gifts of God in the same manner:

- **Psalm 106:24** Then they despised the pleasant land; they did not believe his promise.
- **Ezekiel 22:8** 8 You have despised my holy things and desecrated my
- **Psalm 107:11** <sup>11</sup> for they had rebelled against the words of God and despised the counsel of the Most High.
- 2 Chronicles 36:16 <sup>16</sup> But they mocked God's messengers, despised his words and scoffed at his prophets until the wrath of the LORD was aroused against his people and there was no remedy.
- Ezekiel 16:59 <sup>59</sup> "'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: I will deal with you as you deserve, because you have despised my oath by breaking the covenant.
- **Psalm 22:6** <sup>6</sup> But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by men and despised by the people.

The Bible shows how many ways we can find ourselves despising not only the gifts of God's daily provision, holiness, counsel and promises, but God himself. As I read this list this Christmas, I am cut to the heart knowing that I have been guilty of each type at some point in my life. But something perplexes me about all of this. God knew mankind would despise his gifts, yet he sent Jesus, the perfect gift, to us for our salvation anyway. "He chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things - and the things that are not - to nullify the things that are, so that no one may boast before him."

God gave the gift of his son whom he knew we would despise, a gift that resulted in righteousness, holiness and redemption for us all. He gave his son, despite our despising him and "throwing him down onto the floor," to save us and turn our hearts back toward him. Once we were alienated from God and were enemies in our minds because of our evil behavior. But now we have been reconciled by Christ's physical body through death so he can present us holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation (Colossians 1:21-22). This act of reconciliation shows how truly gracious God is. While we were yet enemies of God, Christ died for us and turned us back to him in a renewed relationship.

As I reflect on what God has done, it brings to mind how special Christ's birth really is, and I want to worship God more. God loves me no matter how much I have despised him. Please, join with me this season with grateful hearts celebrating the gifts God has given us and thanking Him for how wonderous and blessed God the Father and the gift of our Lord Jesus really are.

#### A Message from Your President



And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous—to make ready a people prepared for the Lord. Luke 1:17

This verse from Luke is a customary part of our Advent scripture readings, we've heard it read, and probably read it ourselves, many times over

about the assignment given John, the Baptist son of doubting and muted Zechariah. But as often happens, we hear things new in the common. What struck me and would not leave my head is the phrase highlighted in blue - to make ready a people prepared for the Lord. Perhaps my sensitivity was heightened as I led the Whiz Kids through the church. I asked them whether they noticed any difference from the last time they were in there, of course hoping they would see the obvious, all the decorations heralding the season. This led to my contemplating later, with some dismay and reminiscing, that which I have yet to do!

For instance, placing precious old or sparkling new Christmas decorations on OLD dust is not acceptable! We must clean EVERYTHING before decorating. And even before hanging Christmas balls on the fresh, new tree, they must all be dusted. Then I was led to further contemplate what all the preparation/decoration accomplishes and, finally, how does one truly become *a people prepared for the Lord*?

The conclusion I came to is pretty simple in thought, tougher to achieve, but one I shall strive for inspired by John. His purpose was singular (to prepare the people), his attitude unpresumptuous, humble, (*He (Christ) must increase*, but I must decrease.[John 3:30]), his decoration simple (a coat of camel's hair). So here's my plan and I hope it can be ours collectively. The best way for me to prepare-by-decrease is to set aside my ornately decorated robe of self-righteousness and put on Jesus' offered robe of His righteousness - laced with humility, sparkling with the joy of thanksgiving and hemmed all around in the strength of faith and forgiveness. Then so decorated, let me/us be found in the same place and state of mind as our sister Mary - [Luke 10:42] at his feet, in rapt attention, ready to receive the one thing needful - HIM! Blessings to us all for a well-prepared CHRISTmas.



**Council Actions:** The primary focus of the November council meeting was the final preparation of the recommended 2022 budget and firming up the ideas around managing our funds for presentation to the voters. Consensus was also reached to not meet in December and to support the Federation budget as presented.

Your council is still in need of a volunteer for appointment to **the position of Secretary**. The Secretary is a voting member of council and a trustee, responsible for recording the minutes of both council and voter meetings.

While the council will not meet in December, the **Finance Committee** will meet to oversee financials and continue its work on an Employee Policy.

**Voter Actions:** While the main focus of the November 14 meeting was the 2022 budget, which was approved as presented, the voters also took action on: 1) moving dollars to the Building Fund; 2) moving dollars to the Operating Reserve Fund; 3) establishing a '13th Month' debt reduction fund with the goal of reducing the mortgage principal by \$100k in the next 5 years; 4) accepting new members into the congregation; and 5) approving the Federation budget.


#### Women's Bible Breakfast ● Saturday ● December 11
