Today is a Good Day to Pray

Have you ever watched a movie in which a group of men were about to go into a hopeless battle and one of them says, "Today is a good day to die"? They are preparing themselves for the inevitable, steeling their nerves. That type statement is a sure sign that they have no hope.

But God gives us a different perspective. Luke 18:1-8 says, "And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart." (This is the parable of the unrighteous judge and the persistent widow). For us, today is a good day to pray.

We have so much to pray for: relief from Covid and other diseases, God's provision of a new pastor, less stress in our days, calmness in dealing with others. That's just the stuff we need help with. We can also offer prayers of Thanksgiving for our loving spouses, the blessings God has poured into our lives at church, the food on our tables, friends willing to help us.

Yet, a lack of prayer is one of our greatest failings. We get busy and forget. We don't take our real needs and concerns to God. Worry works better anyway. If we do pray, we pray quickly because we have other things to do. Perhaps our lack of prayer indicates that we really don't care whether our requests are answered or not. Or

we aren't grateful for or don't care whether we have the blessings God has provided us. Maybe it indicates that we don't trust God to answer our prayers. We think, "God is going to do what he wants anyway." Today is a good day to pray. God does want to hear from us; He wants to walk with us in the garden. Our prayers are our acknowledgement that we need God and trust in him to care for us. Our prayers indicate our desire to be with God.

God promises he will listen to our prayers. Matthew 7:7-8 says, "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. ⁸ For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened." So today, pray about the joys in your life. Pray about your concerns, and pray about your needs. Pray that specific people you know will come to know the Lord. Because today is a good day to pray. And tomorrow, when it becomes today will be a good day to pray too. Council in October - In person and online

Council reached consensus on: 1) assigning responsibility for safe deposit keys to the president and vice president while the finance committee continues work on the security policy; 2) the proposed 2021 budget to be presented to voters on November 11.

One item of business was conducted via email vote which was to officially engage Church Mutual for Worker Comp insurance, switching from KEMI. The rate is better and coverage as good or better.

In anticipation of having a new pastor, the **2021 budget** will be much the same as 2020 - a pretty consistent need of \$20k a month in giving. We currently lag behind that expectation in our revenue plan. While the stewardship board will conduct a fall campaign focused on anticipated needs for moving a pastor and for the building fund, we need, as a church body, to elevate our level of giving to what it was at the beginning of the year, pre-COVID and pre-vacancy. *Please pray for wisdom and fearless faith in this matter - sacrificing with thanksgiving that redounds to the glory of God!*

In other news...

Voters on Sunday, October 11, approved the modifications to the constitution and bylaws and also adopted two fund policies that replace those adopted in May of 2014. All items were provided to the voters in advance. The next step will be to affirm the submission process at the November voter meeting prior to the official submission.

Finally, I encourage all of us to consider how we express our *thanks* to our most gracious and glorious God. Yes times are frustrating and inconvenient. To that I say - and? No matter the challenges, and especially in them, we the church are blessed to be a blessing, with *thanksgiving*! As a church, we do not exist for ourselves, but for the works God has prepared for us to do. Let us show our *thanksgiving*, not only to our church but those who do not know the church.
