A Marvelous Time

In Noah's through Mose's days, there weren't written scriptures. Council Actions: The leadership team last met in October. The primary agenda item was next year's budget and the acceptance of the resignation of Secretary, **Karen Neubauer**. Thank you, Karen, for your faithful service.

The Secretary position remains open. The constitutional requirements are: The secretary shall maintain accurate minutes of regular and special voter meetings of the congregation and records of all decisions made by the congregation at such meetings. From the by-laws: 1) The secretary shall record and distribute the minutes of each church council meeting. 2) The office of vice president, secretary, financial secretary, the head elder and approximately half of the elders will be elected in the second quarter of odd numbered years, taking office on July 1. 3) The trustees of the congregation shall be the president, the vice president, the treasurer and the secretary.

If you would like to be considered for appointment to the position for the remainder of the current term, through June of 2025, please let any council member know your willingness, and/or to ask any questions.

Consensus Finance: After discussion regarding how best to present the current financial position and a reasonable budget for the coming year, it was agreed that the voter meeting would be best held in early December in order to provide the most up-to-date report of actual giving and expenses.

Consensus Elders: All of us have the responsibility to communicate desires and provide feedback around worship and bible studies and should do so as new studies are offered and holiday season worship begins


