Music to My Ears

The other day a group of us guys were talking about music. All of them played instruments except me, so I was doing more half-listening than anything. At one point in the conversation, one of the guys mentioned a friend who played in a band. This friend was self-taught and was apparently very good. The friend thought he knew everything about music. Then the friend decided to take lessons. Apparently, although he had played in a band in front of crowds for a long time, he became surprised at what he learned from the lessons and how little he really knew about chord variations and playing his instrument.

This made me think about my spiritual walk with the Lord. Like the guys who took music lessons in middle and high school, I went to Sunday School and confirmation class when I was a kid. After that most of the guys had no more formal training in music but they continued to play. And through my younger adult years, I continued to profess my faith in Jesus although I did not read or study my Bible much. I was like the friend before he decided to take music lessons; I thought I knew enough about God. It wasn't until later in life when I "started taking lessons", when I got back into reading and studying scripture, that I realized how little I knew about God and the "immeasurable riches of his grace." I was joyfully surprised at how much more I was learning.

Paul prays for us in Ephesians 1:17, "that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better". When it comes to our Father in

heaven, our Lord Jesus, and the Holy Spirit, there is always something more for us to learn.

The apostle Peter says in 1 Peter 1:10-12:

¹⁰ Concerning this salvation, the prophets who prophesied about the grace that was to be yours searched and inquired carefully, 11 inquiring what person or time the Spirit of Christ in them was indicating when he predicted the sufferings of Christ and the subsequent glories. ¹² It was revealed to them that they were serving not themselves but you, in the things that have now been announced to you through those who preached the good news to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven, things into which angels long to look.

'Remind them to be subject to rulers and authorities, to obey, to be ready for every good work, 'to speak evil of no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing all humility to all men. Titus 3:1-2 (NKJV)

The following is taken from Ohio District President Rev. Kevin Wilson's 8/25 COVID-19 letter to Congregations: Since the initial letter, the assertion that wearing a mask demonstrates love for my neighbor was challenged. The primary issue was whether face masks slow or prevent the spread of COVID-19.

When it comes to medical science, I'm a layman. I'm trusting in specialists. In this case, I turn to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). On July 14, the CDC posted that face covering is effective against the spread of COVD-19, [and] thus recommended the wearing of face masks. Based on this information, one way we can express God's love for our neighbor is through wearing a face mask.

A related discussion the past month and a half deals with faith. In whom are we placing our trust when we wear face masks? Are we trusting in God? Or are we trusting in medical science or civil leaders? These questions are especially pertinent now, since Ohio, West Virginia and Kentucky all require face masks be worn in public. This quandary is resolved with passages such as **Titus 3:1-2.**

In turning to Scripture to address such issues, we are first turning to God. When we submit to teachings in Scripture, we are being obedient to God. Out of respect for God, we submit to civil authorities.

In these difficult times, and all times, it is good counsel to turn to Scripture for wisdom in traversing the many complexities presented in life, especially now by the pandemic and the systemic ways we view our fellow citizens of this world.

The invitation to have a neighborly chat over the 'Zoom' fence is still open. The next opportunity is **September 1 at 8 pm**. The reminder with the link will go out on the 31st. There is a lot going on... Call committee, COVID, anticipation of restarting more activities,

constitution, bylaws, committees.... and more. Conversation to keep us connected is even more important. Do you have an idea, concern, question, perspective you wish to express? Could be on anything - church or even the perspective presented in this text. Conversation, idea sharing and constructive criticism with Christian charity (and mercy) are encouraged.



Council reached consensus on: 1) The proposed updated fund policies as amended which will be distributed to the congregation along with the constitution and bylaws in anticipation of a special voter meeting in October; 2) Pursuing a plan proposed by the stewardship board for a specifically focused fall campaign; 3) Participation in the Boone County river clean up in October as a fund raiser for youth participation in the national convention.

We are still in **need of a Council Secretary**. The appointment would continue through June 2021 when the position is up for official election. Please remember your council servants and support them with your prayers, your encouragement, your gratitude and your time as you have the opportunity.

We continue to lag behind on our revenue plan. The stewardship board will conduct a fall campaign focused on anticipated needs for calling and moving a pastor and for the building fund.

In other news...



The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod LCMS Stewardship Ministry – September 2020

"Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10).

God bids us to be faithful in the tasks He calls us to do. He calls us to be members of a family (husbands and wives; fathers and mothers; sons and daughters). He calls us to be members of society (those who govern and those who are governed). And He calls us to be members of His family, the Church (those who preach and teach and those who hear and learn). Each of these callings from God places a duty on us.

As members of a family, husbands are given the duty to die for their wives as Christ gave His life for His bride, the Church; while wives are given the duty to respect their husbands and submit themselves to them as the Church does to Christ. Fathers and mothers are to raise their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord, teaching them the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Scriptures concerning Baptism, Confession, the Office of the Keys, and the Lord's Supper. Children are to honor their parents throughout their lives, and even when their parents are no longer alive, serving and obeying them, loving and cherishing them, and speaking well of them.

As members of society, God calls those who govern to bear the sword, that is, to punish those who do evil (those who live contrary to God's will) and to reward those who do good (those whose lives are lived in conformity with God's will). Those who are governed are to obey their leaders as to the Lord Himself, for their leaders bear the sword of God's temporal justice for a purpose.

As members of God's own family, the Church, He calls those who preach and teach to do so in faithfulness to His holy Word. To preach and teach the Law of God to convict the hearts of hearers of their sin and to encourage, admonish, and exhort them to do good works in accordance with God's will. They are to preach and teach the Gospel, the full forgiveness of their sins accomplished by Christ and received through faith, not by works. They are to administer the means of grace in accordance with the Gospel and the Word of God. They do all this for the young and old alike, for those who are near and far off. Those who hear and learn are to submit themselves to their preachers and teachers. They are support them by their prayers and their gifts.

Each of these callings from God place a duty on us. They make a claim on our presence; on our prayers; and our time, talents, and treasures. So, "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10). Pray for your family, your government, and your church. Give of yourself by means of your time, your talents, and your treasures to your family, your government, and your Church. That is what it means to be faithful in the tasks that God has given us. That is what it means to do it with all your might.
